About the Journal:

The *Journal of Intercultural Studies* showcases innovative scholarship about emerging cultural formations, intercultural negotiations and contemporary challenges to cultures and identities. It welcomes theoretically informed articles from diverse disciplines that contribute to the following discussions:

- Reconceptualising notions of nationhood, citizenship and belonging;
- Questioning theories of diaspora, transnationalism, hybridity and 'border crossing', and their contextualised applications;
- Exploring the contemporary sociocultural formations of whiteness, ethnicity, racialization, postcolonialism and indigeneity;
- ❖ Examining how past and contemporary key scholars can inform current thinking on intercultural knowledge, multiculturalism, race and cultural identity.

JICS special issues (and sections) speak to one or more of these criteria, providing focused critical engagement on a given subject, or detailing new lines or methods of inquiry in a field.

Special Issues are comprised of ten original articles (approximately 8000 words) and one guest editorial critical introduction (approximately 3000 words).

Special Sections are comprised of five original articles (approximately 8000 words) and one guest editorial critical introduction (approximately 3000 words).

As guest-editor(s), it is understood that you will:

- 1. Solicit and vet 10-11 articles of relevance for consideration in the special issue or 5 articles for a special section.
- 2. Undertake the majority of contributor liaison.
- 3. Guest Editors are also responsible for Peer Reviewing (double-blind) of papers via the Journal's ScholarOne Manuscript Central website and make recommendations to Managing Editors post-review regarding direction and nature of revisions required.
- 4. Guest Editors check revised articles to ensure quality and that authors have addressed referee concerns and JICS style notes. Edit articles for language.

5. Provide a substantial critical introduction (approximately 3000 words) for the special issue/section.
