



## INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS

Separation & Purification Reviews provides comprehensive summaries and interdisciplinary viewpoints of significant developments in all areas of separation and purification, including innovative methods, apparatus, theories, and applications. The journal presents reviews that cover a large amount of scientific/technical information in a concise organized manner on topics such as adsorption, centrifugation, chromatography, electrophoresis, crystallization, distillation, extraction, filtration, ion exchange, membrane separations, and more.

Each paper judged by Separation and Purification Review editors to have potential for publication in the journal will be peer-reviewed. Downloaded computer lists of publications will be immediately rejected, please see the journal philosophy and spirit in the article: Berthod, A. *So what? or Required content of a review article*, Sep. Purif. Rev. **2009**, 38: 203-206. Manuscripts will be accepted with the understanding that their content is unpublished and is not being submitted for publication elsewhere. Authors are responsible for obtaining permission to reproduce copyrighted material from other sources and are required to sign an agreement for the transfer of copyright to the publisher.

All materials must be typed (12-point font) and singlespaced on 8.5 x 11 inch or A4 formatting with 1-inch margins in a common word processor, e.g. MS Word. Number manuscript pages and submit **the editable version** (no PDF). Each article should be summarized in an abstract of no more than 100-150 words. Authors must give approximately five key words that identify the most important subjects covered by the paper as well as the names and e-mails of at least two experts able to evaluate the text.

**Notes and References.** Reference should be **numbered in [brackets]** as they appear in the text. Include only references to books, articles and bulletins actually cited in the text. Refrain the number of cited works to a **maximum of 150-170**. References should cite all author's last names, initials, title, journal name, year of publication, volume, first-last pages, and DOI code. All authors must be named up to 10, after which the "et al" shortening is allowed.

**Spelling and Hyphenation.** The authority is Webster's Unabridged Dictionary.

**Affiliation.** On the title page, include full name of the authors, academic or professional affiliations, a brief running head, and the complete address (including email address) of the person to whom proofs and correspondence should be sent.

**Tables.** Tables should be gathered at the end of the manuscript, being clearly typed with single spacing. Number tables with consecutive Arabic numerals and give a clear descriptive heading. Avoid the use of vertical rules in tables. Table footnotes should be typed below the table, designated by superior lowercase letters. A list of captions should be typed on a separate sheet and included with the typescript.

**Illustration.** Figures should be gathered at the end of the manuscript **not exceeding a dozen**.

Submitted figures (line drawings, halftones, photos, photo-micrographs, etc.) should be clean originals or digital files. Digital files are recommended for highest quality reproduction and should follow these guidelines:

- 300 dpi or higher, text should be big enough,
- sized to fit on journal page,
- JPG, EPS, TIFF, or PSD format only,
- submitted as separate files, or, if possible, embedded at the end of the WORD text file.

Color illustrations will be considered for publication but will only appear on the internet electronic file; the paper publication will be b&w; however, paper color publication is possible if the author accept to bear the full cost involved in their color paper printing and publication. The charge for the first page with colors is \$1000.00. The next three pages with colors are \$450.00 each. A custom quote will be provided for color art totaling more than 4 journal pages. Good quality color prints or files should be provided in their final size. The publisher has the right to refuse publication of color prints deemed unacceptable.

**Proofs.** Each corresponding author will receive a PDF file of the final version of their article.
