Guidelines for Special Issue Proposals in Innovation and Development

Introduction: Innovation and Development is dedicated to the publication of Special Issues, especially when focusing on topics that are relevant to current priority themes (see aims and scope). Given our quarterly publication frequency, our editorial strategy allows for the acceptance of one Special Issue, consisting of approximately 10 papers, per year. To maintain the high standards of our journal, we adopt a selective approach, emphasizing the importance, timeliness, and quality of contributions to the field.

Submission Schedule: The Editors-in-Chiefs conduct biannual reviews of proposals in March and September. Submissions for consideration must be made by the 1st day of these respective months.

Proposal Structure: To facilitate a comprehensive review, please adhere to the following structure when submitting a 3–5-page proposal:

1. Basic Information:

- Provisional title
- Proposed Guest Editors

2. Overview:

- Proposed topic with an outline of scope and structure
- Academic rationale, emphasizing the contribution to field development
- Special circumstances (e.g., conferences, major research projects)
- Justification for a Special Issue over regular journal submissions

3. Possible Contributors:

- If known, provide a list of potential authors and their proposed topics
- If not known, outline the steps for identifying and inviting contributors

4. Review Process:

- Outline the stages of submission, review, and decision-making
- Specify the role of workshops, meetings, or other components in the process
- Briefly describe the editorial experience of proposed Guest Editors

5. Schedule:

- Provide a timeline for key steps in the process
- Indicate the expected date for submission to the publishers
