

Figures

- Figures (diagrams, graphs, maps, photographs) should be submitted in TIFF, PNG, or high-quality JPEG format, one Figure per file (max. 20 MB), with no embedded Figure captions. Multipart Figures juxtaposed in one image file.
- Should be reproducible to published page width (16.8 cm) or column width (8 cm). Line thickness on drawings should allow for reduction. Letters and numerals should not be less than 2 mm in the final printed illustration.
- The total number of pixels (height × width) less than 40 megapixels.
- Figures must be sharp (at least 300 dpi, preferably 600 dpi).
- All maps, diagrams, and graphs surrounded by a thin box frame.
- Aim for a balanced overall appearance, with no large blocks of very dark shading.
- All maps should include:
 1. scale, (with ‘km’ or other abbreviation at the right-hand end)
 2. simple north point
 3. pairs of geographical coordinates marked on the box frame or other information to fix the geographical position (e.g. paired Northing and Easting divisions, Arctic Circle) (see recent issues for style)
 4. if used, ‘Key’, not ‘Legend’.
- Any lettering crossing other lines or shading should be placed in a ‘white box’ or the lines or shading should be broken where the lettering crosses them.
- All place names mentioned in the text should be shown on a Figure, or their position and distance relative to a named place should be described in the text.
- Figure captions should be concise and provide sufficient information to allow the figure to be understood without reference to the text. Where relevant, indicate the date of the information. Cite secondary sources if used.
- Photographs source style: (Photo: name of photographer, year date).
