In-text citations	
Basic citation formats	<p>Cite a resource in the text by (1) the surname(s) of its author(s); (2) its publication year; and (3) a page number or page numbers, when necessary (e.g., with a direct quotation). These elements of citation can be formatted in two ways. A resource can be cited with the author surnames incorporated into the running text and the publication year and page number(s) set inside parentheses, with a comma after the year and before the page number(s):</p> <p>This phenomenon occurs frequently, according to Smith and Jones (2018).</p> <p>Smith and Jones's (2018) landmark study offers valuable insights.</p> <p>Smith and Jones (2018, 67) consider "indulgent parenting... a danger to the average child."</p>

	<p>A resource can also be cited with all elements contained in parentheses and situated before terminal punctuation (e.g., comma, period, semicolon) in a sentence. No comma should separate the author surname(s) from the publication year. When a page number is included in the citation, a comma should appear after the publication year. If the citation appears within a parenthetical phrase, square brackets should be used to set the publication year and, if present, the page number apart from the author surname(s).</p> <p>This phenomenon occurs frequently (Smith and Jones 2018).</p> <p>Several landmark studies offer valuable insights (see, especially, Smith and Jones [2018, 67] on the dangers of “indulgent parenting”).</p>
Multiple resources cited	<p>When citing multiple resources in a parenthetical citation, two rules apply. First, separate citations by unique sets of authors with semicolons:</p> <p>(Jones 2018; Smith 2010)</p> <p>(Smith 2010; Smith and Jones 2018)</p> <p>Second, when citing multiple resources by the same author(s), include the surname(s) with the first resource’s publication year, omit the surname(s) from subsequent citations, and separate each publication year with a comma:</p> <p>(Jones 2010a, 2010b, 2018)</p> <p>(Jones 2010a, 2010b, 2018; Smith 2010; Smith and Jones 2018)</p> <p>The resources can be arranged, first, alphabetically by author surnames, then, chronologically for each author set by publication year.</p>

<p>Citation with a direct quotation</p>	<p>A citation within the running text can appear before or after a direct quotation:</p> <p>According to Smith and Jones (2018, 67), "indulgent parenting is a danger to the average child."</p> <p>One might consider "indulgent parenting... a danger to the average child," as Smith and Jones (2018, 67) do.</p> <p>Parenthetical citations should appear before terminal punctuation (e.g., comma, period, semicolon) that follows the direct quotation:</p> <p>It is difficult to dispute the claim that "indulgent parenting is a danger to the average child" (Smith and Jones 2018, 67).</p> <p>It is difficult to dispute the claim that "indulgent parenting is a danger to the average child" (Smith and Jones 2018, 67), but researchers should entertain other opinions.</p> <p>Longer quotations (over 100 words or six lines of manuscripts text) should be set off in a "block." Parenthetical citations appear after any punctuation that ends block quotations:</p> <p>... indulgent parenting is a danger to the average child. (Smith and Jones 2018, 67)</p>
	<p>The basic formats for citations with different numbers of authors are as follows:</p> <p>One author: Smith (2018) or (Smith 2018)</p> <p>Two authors: Smith and Jones (2018) or (Smith and Jones 2018)</p> <p>Three or more authors: Smith et al. (2018) or (Smith et al. 2018)</p>

	<p>Use “and,” not an ampersand (&), to separate names in the citation of a two-author resource and a serial comma with “and” in the citation of a three-author resource. When a resource has four or more authors, list the first author’s surname followed by “et al.” If shortening the author listing would render the citations of two or more resources identical, list enough additional surnames before “et al.” in the citations to make their authorship distinguishable.</p> <p><u>Example</u> Smith, Jones, Johnson, Rogers, and Hart (2018)</p> <p style="text-align: center;">AND</p> <p>Smith, Jones, Rogers, Johnson, and Hart (2018)</p> <p style="text-align: center;">BECOME</p> <p>Smith, Jones, Johnson, et al. (2018) and Smith, Jones, Rogers, et al. (2018) to avoid Smith et al. (2018) citations that might refer to two different resources.</p>
	<p>If two or more authors have the same surname, include the given-name initial(s) of the authors in each citation. With citations in the running text, the initials precede the surname:</p> <p>G. Smith (2012) and F. Smith (2008)</p> <p>With parenthetical citations, the initials are placed after the surname, without periods:</p> <p>(Smith F 2008; Smith G 2012)</p>
<p>No author</p>	<p>If a resource has no author, include a shortened form of the resource’s title in lieu of an author name followed by the publication year and, as needed, a page number or page numbers. Book titles should be in italics.</p> <p>Book: (<i>Shortened Title of the Book</i> 2018) Other references: (“Shortened Title of Other Reference Type” 2018)</p>

In press	Use "forthcoming" instead of a publication year for all in-press citations: (Smith, forthcoming)
Tables and figures	Resources cited in tables or figure legends should follow the standard format and must be included in the reference list.

Order	<p>Order reference entries alphabetically by author surnames. Entries without authors should be ordered alphabetically among the other entries by their title.</p> <p>A single-author entry precedes a multi-author entry that begins with the same surname and given name.</p> <p>Successive entries by two or more authors when only the first author is the same are alphabetized by co-authors' last names. If reference entries have the full same author listings, arrange the entries by their years of publication, with undated works at the end. If the reference list contains two or more entries by the same author(s) with the same publication year, list them alphabetically by title of the work and add the designators "a," "b," "c," etc. to the years in sequence:</p> <p>Green ML. 2012a. Book title.</p> <p>Green ML. 2012b. Title of book.</p> <p>These designators should be employed in citations:</p> <p>Green (2012a)</p> <p>Green (2012b)</p> <p>(Green 2012a, 2012b)</p>

<p>Form of author name</p>	<p>For all authors, use initials, without periods or spaces between them, in lieu of expanded given and middle names. Include the authors' surnames in full. The listing for each author should be in inverted-order surname-first format. Commas should separate individual author names. The word "and" should not precede the final author name for reference entries with ten or fewer authors. If more than ten individuals authored a resource, the reference entry documenting the resource should list the first ten authors followed by "et al." The entry should be ordered alphabetically in the reference list by its title, ignoring any initial “The,” “a,” or “an” in the title:</p> <p>A book title with no author. 2018. Smith A. 2015. Titles	<p>The titles of book references should appear in Roman font with sentence style capitalization. The titles of book chapters, reports, and papers should appear in Roman font with sentence style capitalization. Journal article titles should appear in Roman font with sentence style capitalization. The titles of journals in the same reference entries, though, should appear in italics with headline style capitalization (i.e., capitalize first words of title and subtitle, as well as all nouns, pronouns, verbs, adjectives, and adverbs, regardless of length). The titles of journals, moreover, should be abbreviated in accordance with ISO 4 List of Title Word Abbreviations (LTWA) standards.</p>

<p>Place of publication and publisher name for books and reports</p>	<p>Any initial “the” and concluding “Inc.,” “Ltd”, “Co.,” “Publishing Co.,” etc. should be omitted from the publisher name in the reference entry. The place of publication should always include a state/province abbreviation or country, even if the city is a familiar one.</p> <p>Cambridge (MA): Harvard University Press Cambridge (UK): Cambridge University Press New York (NY): Macmillan Englewood Cliffs (NJ): Prentice Hall Washington (DC): Smithsonian Institution Press Chapel Hill (NC): University of North Carolina Press</p>
<p>Issue numbers and DOIs for journals</p>	<p>The issue number can be omitted from a journal-article entry if the journal is paginated consecutively through the volume (or if month or season is included), but it is not incorrect to include it. When volume and issue number alone are used, the issue number is within parentheses. If only an issue number is used, it is not within parentheses.</p> <p>Digital object identifiers (DOIs) are commonly featured in reference entries for journal articles, as well as in entries for other types of electronic resources. Authors do not need to include DOIs for published journal articles when preparing manuscripts. If they are retrievable from registries, the DOIs for published journal articles will be added to entries as links during the production process.</p>
<p>In press</p>	<p>“Forthcoming” should be used in lieu of a publication year for any in-press references.</p>
<p>Pagination</p>	<p>With page ranges, include all digits, even if the end page number repeats the thousand and/or hundred digit(s) found in the first page number. Insert “p.” before the page range in book chapter references.</p> <p>Nguyen FM, Anh LN. 2012. Title of journal article. Jnl Title. 1:1137–1178.</p> <p>Valesco B. 2015. Title of book chapter.
