## **Reviews Format**

Reviews should be approximately 1,000 words (unless otherwise agreed) and should be submitted as a single Word Document via email to the Reviews Editor.

Reviews should contain the following components:

- Title in the following format: book title, author name, publisher location and title, year of publication, pagination, format and ISBN number. For example:
  - Technocrats and the Politics of Drought and Development in Twentieth Century Brazil, by Eve. E. Buckley, University of North Carolina Press, 2017, 298 pp., Paperback, ISBN 978-1-4696-3430-2
- Main body of the review in Times New Roman 12-point font that is double-line spaced, with margins of at least 2.5 cm (or 1 inch)
- References (if any are included) in Chicago author-date style
- Reviewer name, affiliation and email address
